A LITTLE HISTORY

According to legend, the establishment on the northwest corner of South 27th street and Oklahoma Avenue was a Speakeasy during prohibition. Some say the name of the saloon was Fisher's. At that time this was considered the edge of town. After prohibition, Gene Pinkala opened a bar in the building. In 1937 eight bowling lanes were added. Gene's two sons, Bob and Wayne, grew up in the business and took it over in the 1950's because of their fathers ailing health. By 1960 a new 16 lane "Bowlers Hall of Fame" was added to an already well-established business and the brothers even put their names in the bowling record books! In 1990 Pinky's was torn down for the expansion of St. Luke's Hospital.

TRICK OR TREAT SAFETY

It's that time of year again neighbors for the infamous JPCA's annual Night Out Halloween Trick or Treat! After the challenges we faced as a nation last year there is a lot of pent-up excitement for this year's event. So, with that being said, let's take a moment to review some important Trick or Treating Safety tips for this year's Halloween!

- Review the Route- If trick or treating without adult supervision make sure to review the trick or treating route in the neighborhood with parents and expected times to be home. Stay on the planned route.
- Team Up- Do not trick or treat alone. Try to team up with other kids or groups to ensure your safety and so people will notice if you are missing.
- 3. Light up your way! Carry a flashlight or glow stick

- 4. Don't be a Drag- Make sure your costume does not drag on the ground. Material could attach to an object or get stepped on by someone causing a fall and possible injury.
- 5. Don't Play in the Street- Stay on sidewalks whenever possible. If you have to walk in the street always stay to the side of the street facing the oncoming traffic and walk in a single file line.
- Get off my Lawn! Little joke there but be careful running across yards. If a home is decorated with lights or Halloween decorations, ground stakes, wires or extension cords it could create tripping hazards. Ask for permission if you want to have a picture taken before walking in a person's yard.
- Watch Where you Point that Thing- Carry only flexible knives, swords axes or other similar props. Be careful with props like spears or wands.
- DO NOT ENTER- Only accept candy in doorways and never enter a home or apartment without adult supervision with someone you know.
- 9. Beware of the Beast- Stay away from animals you are not familiar with.
